This newsletter is the first communication to former choristers and lay clerks of the St. Albans Cathedral and Abbey Girls' Choirs since the Reunion Choral Evensong which took place on 30th June.

The organisers of the reunion felt that it had been such a success that St. Albans Cathedral should have its own Ex-Choristers Association as, indeed, do many other Cathedrals in the United Kingdom, and hold similar reunions each year. A number of things are already taking place to make this happen.

In addition, and as a response to a suggestion from a former chorister, those people who have an interest in the Association, but were not members of the choirs, may apply to be Associate Members – this will enable them to be included on mailing lists and attend events.

We are now attempting to extend our database of members and a directory is being compiled as part of the website. However, only member's data that is in the public domain will be published on the website.

Loss of an Old Friend



Ron Gough 18th November 1917 - 6th October 2007

Former "Gentleman of the Choir" Ron Gough passed away on 6th October. Many of you will know that he had a career with Barclays Bank and his experience there stood him in good stead when, in his retirement, he did various jobs at the Abbey; first as the Abbey accountant at the time when the Chapter House was being built, later on the Refectory till and more recently helping to count the collection monies on a Monday morning. As a boy treble Ron sang in the choir of St. Albans, Holborn and then at St. Paul's, Camden Square. He joined St. Albans Cathedral Choir as a Bass in 1957 and being King's Scout his help in running the first choir camp at Luccombe in 1958 was invaluable.

Ron played bowls with the Townsend Club, walked with the St. Albans Footpath Society, played bridge with the Friday Bridge Club, and always, until recently, cycled everywhere around St. Albans. Latterly he was a member of the Abbey Servers Guild and a founder member of the St. Albans Probus Club. For several years Ron sang with the St. Albans Chamber Choir and enjoyed their visits to Worms in Germany to give joint concerts with the Wormser Kantorei.

The bass line of several choirs around the St. Albans area will be the poorer for his passing: St. Albans Bach Choir, The Music Makers of Harpenden, St. Michael's Church Choir and the Evensong Choir at St. John's Markyate.
