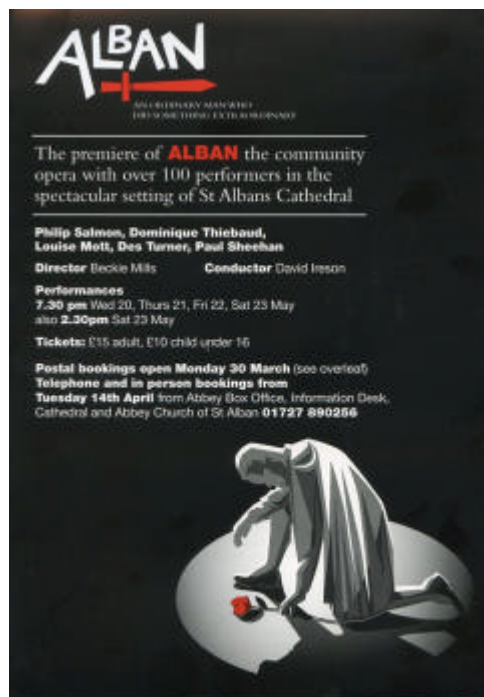
New Members

It is with considerable regret that we advise members that the traditional annual choir camp will no longer take place in its current form. After extensive consultations the Dean and Chapter has decided that because of the lack of succession in camp leadership and staffing, coupled with the constraints of HSE and Child Protection legislation, it can no longer support the camp. Possibly this will be a great disappointment to those who have enjoyed and, indeed, helped to run the camps over the 50 years it existed but assurances have been given that suitable alternatives for current and future choristers will be found.

DVD "The Final Choir Camp"

A DVD of the 50th and 'Final Choir Camp' has been made by John Adams. John is happy to make personal copies available to members of the Association and Cathedral Choir on the basis of a small donation to cover costs. Although it is not the same professional quality as that for the Reunion, it lasts about half an hour and within the framework of the lovely surrounding scenery it shows a weekend visitor's perspective. There is the Porlock Weir area where the older members will remember singing madrigals and other impromptu three-part renderings; it covers visits to the camp site and a very well played Last Post against a backdrop of Robin How; a trek up to Dunkery Beacon with the inevitable photo opportunity at the top; the return via Cloutsham with cream teas at Horner, then a little look in at choir practice and an evening barbeque in the camp field. On the Sunday, lunch at camp after Matins was a big occasion with the cutting of the camp 50th anniversary cake and presentation of a picture to Peter, speeches and votes of thanks, then the final winding up after Evensong with tea at the village hall and presentation of a picture to Bill Partridge for help and hospitality for all those years.
